Curriculum News

Class Banksy

In science this week, the children used their sense of smell to identify different products. These included lemon juice, coffee, paprika, marmite and mustard. In maths, the children have been identifying numbers that are more or less and writing single digits correctly. The children started the book, 'Amazing Grace' and have been identifying different feelings that characters may be feeling in the story. For art, the children have been learning about the South African artist, 'Esther Mahlangu.' There have been some excellent designs and precise colouring.

Class Blake

In maths, the children have been learning to add and subtract multiples of 10 and 100. **For example, $345 + 400 = 745$ and $345 + 40 = 385$.** Using place value has been key for the children to spot patterns when using this method of addition and subtraction. In English, the children have been reading the book 'Amazing Grace.' And planning a diary entry. The children have had to plan what happened, write in the first person, describe feelings, and use **time conjunctions such as after, next, first, then.** In guided reading, the children have been using their inference skills. **For example, 'The man went outside and put up his umbrella.'** How do we know it is raining?

Class Wiltshire

In maths this week, the children have been learning to add and subtract numbers up to six digits. **For example, what is $68,953 + 7,765$?** It has been vital for children to use their place value skills to complete the written method and use known number facts when calculating. As part of Black History Week, the children have been learning about Dr Mae Jamison, her key achievements, and her contributions to science. The children made their own space rockets linked to Mai Jamison.
