Currículum News

Class Rock 'N' Roll

In maths this week, the children in Reception have been copying and creating patterns. The learning began with the children looking at different patterns created with buttons, shapes and coloured beads. **Key questions included, 'What can you see?' What will come next in the pattern?'** The children then created their own patterns and used question prompts such as, '**I have used these beads' and 'Next, I will use this shape in my pattern.'** The children in Year 1 started the week by labelling a number line. The children looked at number lines and discussed with each other where missing numbers would go. As well as this, the children were taught the importance of looking at how much each 'leap' on a number line is worth. The learning then progressed onto the children looking at parts and wholes. For example, 'There are 4 birds in one tree, and 4 in another. What is the part? What is the whole? In science, the children have been using 'taste' when looking at different foods. The children discussed the words sweet, salty, sour, bitter, and savoury. In English, the children have been writing their own 'The Tiger that came to tea' class party.' The children talked about what they did first before writing in the past tense. In art, the children have been looking at the work of Mark Klee and recreating his patterns using mark making.

Class Pop

In maths this week, the children in Year 2 began the week by adding in threes and spotting patterns when doing this. By practising, counting, and remembering times tables is life skill that stays forever, and it is so important. The children in 3 have been adding and subtracting multiples of 10 to 3 digit numbers. For example, What is 742 + 30? In English, the children have continued the over-arching theme of non-chronological reports by using conjunctions to join sentences. The conjunctions used have been the FANBOYS: For, And, Nor, But, Or, Yet, So. For example, 'I do like football, but I prefer rugby. The learning then progressed onto the children chose their own Queen to research - linked to over-arching topic- and then write their own non-chronological report. In science, the children have been learning about muscles in the human body, specifically biceps and triceps. The children have been looking at how muscles work by relaxing and contracting. In guided reading, the children have been using the prediction skills when looking at front covers of books and then discussing the meaning of new words.

Class Dísco

In maths this week, the children in Year 4 have been rounding numbers to the nearest 10 and 100. For example: What is 478 rounded to the nearest 100?' The children in Year 5 have been rounding numbers up to one million. For example, What is 412,454 rounded to the nearest hundred thousand?' The children in Year 6 started the week by learning about prime numbers. A prime number can only be divided by itself and one. For example, 13 is a prime number as the only two numbers that divide it are 1 and 13. 21 is not a prime number as 1, 3, 7 and 21 divide into it. The learning then progressed onto the children learning about square and cubed numbers. For example, 3 squared is 9, and 3 cubed is 27. A favourite question to ask the children is which number is a square and cubed number? 64 as 8 squared is 64 and 4 cubed is 64. In English, the children have been writing their own play script based on the drafts they wrote last week. The children added their own stage directions, detailed dialogue, detailed scene setting and the correct punctuation. In science, the focus has been electricity. The children have been drawing their own symbols and looking at complete and incomplete circuits. Key vocabulary included current, voltage, circuits, cells, batteries, buzzers, and components. For art, the children have been looking at more example of landscape art and using different techniques when sketching and painting.
