Curriculum News

Class Rock 'N' Roll

In English, the children have continued their learning sequence based on 'Supertato.' They have continued to explore the story and have focused on the characters, in particular the villain of the story - Evil Pea. The children created their own evil vegetables including Evil Strawberry and Evil Cucumber. In maths, the children in Reception finished their learning on mass and capacity and have moved onto 'Growing 6, 7 and 8. They have been exploring counting and representing the numbers 6, 7 and 8 and have explored finding 1 more. They have explored answering questions like 'How many are there altogether and How many are there now?' The children in Year 1 continuing their work on addition by exploring doubles and near double. For example, if I know that double 5 is 10 then I know that 5 + 4 will be one less. They then began to explore subtracting by counting back using a number line and by using their number bond knowledge.

In art, the children have been learning about the artist Yayoi Kusama. They looked at different pieces of her work and had to identify similarities and differences and talk about their likes and dislikes. The children then imitated Kusama's artwork using different mark-making skills.

Class Pop

In English, the children have continued their learning sequence based upon 'A Lion in the Meadow' by Margaret Mahy. The children have been exploring descriptive tools with a particular focus on adverbs. They then used this learning to write descriptions of a meadow. The children then had to create and describe their own new characters to replace the lion and the dragon from the story.

In maths, the children in Year 2 have continued to work on multiplication by learning about making arrays. The children then began to use their knowledge of equal groups to support them in developing their understanding of division. The children explored making equal groups by grouping and sharing answering key questions; 'How many are you going to put into each group? How many groups are you going to share them between?' The children in Year 3 have continued to build on their knowledge of multiplication and division by exploring multiples of 5 and 10 and dividing by grouping and sharing. Children moved onto multiplying and dividing by 3, using counters and cubes to represent calculations.

In history, the children continued to learn about different intrepid explorers. This week they learned about the first voyage of Christopher Columbus and order the events on a timeline.

Class Disco

In English, the children have continued work on their class text - How to Train Your Dragon - within this, they have explored using nouns and accurate speech punctuation. The children also had to write a set of instructions for 'How to Train a Dog'.

In maths this week, the children in Year 6 have continued their learning about ratio, exploring the differences between ratio and fractions. They then moved onto learning how to draw to scale and why you might need to this. The children in Year 5 are continued to develop their multiplication skills by multiplying 2-digit by 2-digit and 3-digit by 2-digit numbers. They also answered key questions such as, What is the same and what is different about multiplying a 2-digit number by a 2-digit number by a 2-digit number and multiplying a 3-digit number by a 2-digit number. The children in Year 4 are building on their multiplication skills by learning to multiply by 10 and 100. They have used this knowledge to support them when moving onto dividing by 10. Children noticed that in all the examples they see, they need to "remove the zero" to find the answer.

In art, the children have continued their learning about Frida Kahlo and explored why so much of her work was self-portraits. They learned about the concept of proportionality to ensure accuracy when drawing facial features. The children had the opportunity to implement their learning by drawing the missing half of their face from a photograph self-portrait.
