SPORTS DAY and Water Fight


Our annual Sports Day takes place on Friday 21st of June. This will begin at 09.30 and finish at approximately 11.45. Families can come onto the playground from 09.20.

Curriculum News

Class Banksy

In maths this week, the children in Reception have been looking at units of repeating patterns and understanding shapes and objects that come next. The children used a range of materials to make coloured patterns. For example, red, blue, blue, red, blue, blue. The children then discussed and compared their patterns to other children and adults. The children in Year 1 have started learning about 'Unitising.' This has involved the children looking at different counters and looking at how much each counter is worth. The learning then progressed onto recognising different coins and which coins are real. For example, 'Is there such thing as an 8p coin?' In English, the focus has been looking at dinosaur fact cards and exploring past tense verbs. For example, "The Triceratops stomped/stomps across the ground.' Which verb is in the past tense? The learning then progressed onto looking at the features of non-chronological reports. In history, the children have been looking at the different periods during the age of the dinosaurs: Triassic, Jurassic, and Cretaceous Period. The children had to sort the dinosaurs into what period they lived in.

Class Blake

In maths this week, the children have been exploring hours, days, months, and years. For example. 'How many days are there in one week?' How many days in two weeks?' How many months in one year?' What mathematical skill can help us with these types of questions? Prior to this, the children secured their knowledge and understanding of 'o'clock, half past, and quarter past the hour.' In English, the focus has been information leaflets. The children have looked at a range of information leaflets and identified the key features and what makes a good leaflet. The children then put themselves back into Ancient Greek times and wrote a postcard and their own information leaflet. This linked perfectly with the Greek dress-up day that took place on Wednesday. During the Ancient Greek Day on Wednesday, the children designed their own shields, played some Olympic races, and tried some traditional Greek food.

Class Wiltshire

The children in Year 6 this week have completed a range of mathematical reasoning challenges and have used a range of mental and written strategies when calculating. For example, 'What two prime numbers add together to make a square number?' 'There are 18 girls in a class, 10% of the girls are left-handed. Why cannot this be true?' The children in years 4 and 5 have been focusing on position and direction, which has included lines of symmetry, reflected shapes, and translated shapes across a grid, he children in all year groups have been working very hard when learning and practicing their lines for our end of year performance. All the work we do with the children to promote the love of reading, speaking with expression, understanding humour and realising the effect of formal and informal language has shown this week. In geography, the focus has been lines of latitude and longitude. This will help the children understand time zones across the world. For example, if it is 09.00 in London, it is 03.00 in New York as they are -6 GMT.
