Curriculum News

Class Banksy

In maths this week, the children in Reception have been looking at positional language and describing where things are. For example, 'Where is the duck positioned?' The boy is next to the slide.' The learning then progressed onto saying mathematical sentences such as, 'I have put the book behind the table.' 'The pencil is on top of the paper.' The children in Year 1 have started looking at days of the week and answering questions such as, 'What day comes before Tuesday?' 'What day will be in two days' time?' In science, the focus has been looking at trees in my local area. For example, 'What type of trees jeep their leaves all year?' What type of tree did this leaf come from?' In English, the children have been writing non-chronological reports and linking this to the topic of dinosaurs. The focus has been the children looking at different fact cards about different dinosaurs, and then writing about what dinosaurs like to eat, where they live and what diet they had. In history, the children had to choose their favourite dinosaur, draw it, and then write and interesting fact. The children thoroughly enjoyed reading their facts to other children and adults.

Class Blake

In maths this week, the children have continued building on their knowledge of time, a very abstract concept, and learning about telling the time to quarter past and quarter to. The learning then progressed onto the children learning to tell the time to the nearest 5 minutes. For both year groups, the children needed to secure their knowledge of drawing times on blank clocks to show half past and o'clock. Towards the end of this week, the children started learning the concept of A.M and P.M. In English, the children continued their learning sequence about information leaflets, and then progressing onto writing their own factual leaflets and then editing and improving their own, along with their peers. As well as this, the SPAG focus has been looking at what words we could use to improve our writing. For example, 'Yelled instead of said' And 'Huge instead of big.' In RE, the focus has been the 'Five Pillars of Islam' and the children have been learning what a pilgrimage is.

Class Wiltshire

In maths this week, the children in Years 4 and 5 have been learning about negative numbers. The focus has been the children understanding that when counting backwards and forwards over zero, then this must be counted. For example, 'The difference between - 5 and 3 is 8.' Other questions have included, 'If the temperature was - 5 and it increased by 2 degrees, what is the temperature now?' And 'What is the difference between - 11 and 6?' In English, the children have been continuing their class text of 'Stories from the Lighthouse' and have been discussing new and confusing vocabulary, planning, and writing a diary entry from the perspective of a character in the story and drawing pictures to match events in the story. In Geography, the focus has been longitude and latitude coordinates. The children have looked at different time zones across the world and understood why we have these coordinates to support daylight saving time. In science, the children have been looking at what solids are soluble and insoluble. For example, flour does not fully dissolve in water, so flour is therefore insoluble.
