## Curriculum News

#### Class Rock 'N' Roll

In maths this week, the children in Reception have been learning how to sort, match and compare different objects. The first task was for the children to sort different coloured buttons depending on how many holes they had and what shape. The learning then progressed onto the children sorting other subjects - pens, sticks, socks - and explaining which were the odd ones out and why. The children in Year 1 have been understanding the concept of 1 more when counting to 10. For example, What is one more than 7? 'How do you know?' What picture could we draw to show this? The learning then progressed onto the children counting backwards within 10. For example, 'I am going to count backwards from 4 - what numbers will I say?' In English, the children have continued reading, 'We're going on a bear hunt' and have been thinking of their own obstacles and animal. The children then progressed onto writing their own sentences and finished the week by writing their own version of the story. In science, the children have been exploring the human eye and how they work. Some tasks have included covering one eye and discussing what has happened, how we see in the dark, and how different our eyes our to other people's. In Re, the focus has been The Christmas Story and why Christians celebrate this religious event. It won't be long until the children begin their Nativity rehearsals.

### Class Pop

In English this week, the children have continued with their class text, '**The King's Biscuitz**.' The children designed their own setting for the new character to be a part of - we have seen some fabulous designs. As the week progressed, the children then planned and wrote their own version of the story using adjectives, adverbs, powerful verbs, and descriptive language. To finish, the children then read other children's writing and gave editing suggestions as to how the writing can be made even better. In science, the focus has been which animals have spines. The children have been looking at different animals and understanding the words 'vertebrates and invertebrates.' In maths, the children in Year 2 have been finding missing numbers on number lines, comparing numbers using < and > signs, and solving word problems such as, 'If I have 24 counters, and my friend has 37 counters, how many fewer do I have? The children in Year 3 have been looking at number problems involving more than and less than. For example, What is 100 less than 306? The learning then progressed onto the children using estimation skills to plot numbers onto a blank number line.

#### Class Disco

In maths this week, the children in Year 4 have started to find, 1 more, 10 more, 100 more, and 1000 more. For example, What is 1 more than 302? 10 more than 302? 100 more than 302 and 1000 more than 302? Patterns have been discussed and link to the previous week's learning of place value. The children in Years 5 and 6 have been looking at negative numbers and addition and subtraction of integers. An integer is any whole number and the children have been using a written columnar method to calculate 34,587 + 878,943. In English, the children have continued with their class text and have been learning how to turn direct speech into lines in a play script. The children have also been reading extracts from the book in different tones of voice so that they can see how it might be pronounced aloud depending on the characters" emotions. In science, the children have been learning about microorganisms and classifying them. In geography, the focus has been physical features in Scandinavia, including rivers, mountain ranges and terrains. In art, the focus has been understanding 'Atmospheric Perspective.' The children used different tintz and shades to create atmosphere.
