Curriculum News

Class Banksy

In English this week, the children have been learning how describe characters from a story using their own describing words. The children then progressed onto creating a new toy to be in their story. In art, the focus has been how to weave using natural materials. The children used different threads and wools to do this. Key questions were asked like, 'Can you see the wool interlacing in this picture?' In maths, the children have been learning and recognizing the numbers 17, 18 and 19. This has included matching the numerals to the words. For example, 18 is spelt as eighteen. In science, the focus has been recognising materials around the school and which are made of rock.

Class Blake

In maths this week, the children have been taking part in challenges involving them to count in 2s, 3s, 58 and 108. Times Tables are key for children to access all areas of the maths curriculum and the children have been practicing their counting to improve fluency. In Food D/T, it is time for the children to decide what toppings they would like on their pizzas as they will start making them over the next week. In English, the children have been writing their recounts about 'The Great Fire of London.' The focus has been using fronted adverbials and adventurous language. For example, 'At about 10pm' and 'In the middle of the night.' There has been some excellent writing and presentation!

Class Wiltshire

In history this week, the children have been learning about 'The Magna Carta' and how this is one the most famous documents in world history. The children have been asking questions to find out more: 'Why was the Magna Carta needed?' And 'What is in The Magna Carta?' In English, the children have continued their diary entries linked to the book, 'Children of Winter.' The drafting, editing and final pieces of work have been a joy to read and share! In RE, the children have been learning about the importance of Muhammad to Muslims' daily lives. This has included how he is remembered for his teachings and morals he lived by.
