Curriculum News

Class Banksy

In maths this week, the children in Year 1 have been learning to recognise and understand the numbers 11, 12 and 13. The children then progressed onto understanding 14, 15 and 16. In Reception, the children have been looking at making four and five using five frames to support counting. In art, the children have been looking at different types of animals and how to make your own 'leaf animal' using leaves collected in the playground. In English, the children have continued looking at instructions and how to write s clear set when designing and creating a board game. I enjoyed sharing with the children some of my favourite board games I play with friends and family!

Class Blake

In maths this week, the children have continued learning about how to subtract two- and three-digit numbers using the columnar method. This has included exchanging numbers from the next column. For example, how would we calculate 457 - 178? In history, the children have started to learn about the Great Fire of London. Where did it begin? How did it happen? What was the timeline of events? In D/T, different types of bread were tried, tasted, and evaluated. The 'Perfect Pizzas' unit of work will build up to the children making their own pizzas later in the term. In science, the children have been learning about different amphibians and what they need to survive. For example, why do frogs need leaves and sticks to survive?

Class Wiltshire

In maths this week, the children in Year 6 have been learning how to use a short division method to calculate. For example, what is 754 ÷ 3? How would we set this out? How do we know if there will be a remainder or not? As well as this, the children have been securing their understanding of subtraction of four-digit numbers and exchanging. For example, what is 6573 - 2719? In English, the focus has been emotive language and selecting words that can change or enhance meaning. For example, synonyms for ugly are awful and grotesque. Energetic is a synonym for active and dynamic. The children have then used these words to expand sentences using adverbs and adjectives.
