In assembly this week, I talked to the children about some of the events that are taking place between now and December 20th, and how much of a busy half term this one is.

'Rags to Riches' Collection

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Curriculum News



Class Rock 'N' Roll

In maths this week, the children in Reception have been looking at the numbers 4 and 5 and different representations of these numbers. Key questions have included, 'How many are there altogether?' 'Which card shows the number 5?' The children then progressed onto subitising 4 and 5. For example, 'This card shows the number 6. Show this number on your fingers?' The children in Year 1 have been learning the concept of subtraction. Lots of hands-on resources were used to answer questions such as, 'There were 8 cakes on a plate; 3 got eaten. How many cakes are left?' The learning then progressed onto the children using a number line to support when subtracting and then writing the correct calculation to match. In science, with a cross-curricular link to geography, the focus has been 'Changing Seasons.' The children have been identifying seasons in the year and what happens to the length of days and nights during winter and summer. The learning also included the children looking at what clothes are appropriate for different seasons. In English, the children have been reading the text, 'Oi Frog!' The focus has been rhyming words, putting them in sentences to create a poem and acting out a poem to other children. In D/T, the children have been learning how to use a 'sliding mechanism' to create a moving minibeast across a background. The children explored different materials and discussed with each other how to make the minibeast move effectively.

Class Pop

In English this week, the children have been looking at how to write a diary entry. The focus has been Queen Victoria and the children have been looking at key events during her reign as queen, facts, doing 'hot seating' to answer questions and writing in the first person. The children worked very well in their groups to create their own timelines and draft diary entries from the perspective of Queen Victoria. In maths, the children in Year 2 have been learning to add and subtract across a 10. For example, the children took 16 and 8 and used cubes and then exchanged to show counting across the 10. The same was done with 23 and 8 when subtracting back. The children in Year 3 have been using a columnar method to add 3-digit numbers. For example, 341 + 243 = The learning then progressed onto the children using the exchanging method. For example, 476 + 365 = In Science, the focus has been eating healthily and looking at a balanced diet. The children have been looking at what foods provide the human body with energy, calcium, and vitamins. The children then looked at different food types and wrote down a healthy meal that could prepare and eat. In Geography, the focus has been the continent of Europe. The children first re-capped the names of the seven continents and the discussed that the United Kingdom is in the continent of Europe. The learning then progressed onto naming other countries in Europe.

Class Disco

In maths this week, the children in Year 4 have been adding four-digit numbers and understanding the concept of 'exchanging.' For example, '3467 + 2819 =' 'How do carry to the next column to calculate?' The children in Year 5 and Year 6 have been looking at multi-step calculations with addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. For example, 'A coach can carry 52 people. If there are 17 coaches travelling to a sporting event, what is the total number of people?' The learning then progressed onto the children learning how to use written division to calculate. For example, 'What is 678 divided by 12?' In history, the children have been learning about the Tudor Period and who the Tudors were. The focus was looking at a timeline and completing a Tudor family tree using fact cards and photographs. The learning then progressed onto what clothes people wore during The Tudor Period. In science, the children have been investigating voltage and planned their own experiment. The children were given lots of electrical equipment and they had to make different circuits and test the loudness of buzzers. In English, the children have continued with their Frozen topic and the focus has been biomes in Antarctica. The children have been looking at what wildlife lives there, writing a fact file and in investigating differences and similarities between different biomes.
