Curriculum News

In English this week, linked to well-being week, all children have been reading the book, 'Look Up!' The children have been predicting what they think might happen, using different adjectives for description, acting out different scenes from the story and reading their favourite parts.



For Safer Internet Day, we shared with the children how far a photograph can travel when posted online. Thank you to everyone for sharing and writing where you are from in the world.

Class Banksy

In maths this week, the children in Reception have been comparing mass, weight, and capacity. Key questions included, 'How many more tomatoes are on the scale?' What does it mean the scale is balanced?' The children then had to cut out and order different sized towers. The children in Year 1 have been securing their knowledge of addition and subtraction facts up to 20. For example, 18-5 = and 13 + 6 =. When reading the book 'Look Up' the children have been making links to their own lives by drawing what they would like to be when they are older. It has been lovely to read the children's writing and what their ambitions and dreams are. In science, the focus has been reptiles. The children have been labelling key features such as reptiles, scales, and claws. The learning then progressed onto labelling different types of reptiles.

Class Blake

In maths this week, the focus has been addition and subtraction questions when using cm and mm. For example, what is 5cm + 32mm? The children in Year 3 need to concert 32mm to 3.2 cm and use a columnar method to add. The children in Year 2 have been solving problems involving cm and mm. For example, what is 63cm - 11 cm? and if a toy car is 12cm, and another car is 7cm longer, what is the length of the other car? In music, the children have continued to develop their skills of playing the recorder. In art, the children have continued looking at famous building around the world (Sydney Opera House, Leaning Tower of Pisa, Big Ben and The Taj Mahal). The children then had to cut out a template and make the famous, Sydney Opera House. In geography, the children have been looking at satellite photographs and identifying physical and natural features.

Class Wiltshire

In English this week, the children in Year 4 have started learning about the concept of 'Perimeter.' The children were taught what perimeter means before moving onto calculating. For example, if a rectangle has a length of 8cm and a width of 3 cm, what is the perimeter? The children in Year 5 have been learning how to find fraction of amounts. For example, what is 1/3 of 18? And what is 2/5 of 35? The children in Year 6 have started to learn about algebra and using letter for unknown quantities. For example, if m stands for 4, what is 6m + 17? In art, the children have been learning about The Terracotta Army and studying different symbols and patterns. In RE, the focus has been different faiths and belonging. This has included looking at the work different charities do in our communities.
