# Curriculum News

# Class Banksy

In maths, the children in Year 1 have been learning how to add and subtract 1 and 2 and solve word problems. For example, there are 5 birds in a tree, some more birds land, so there are now 7 in the tree. How many birds landed? The children in reception have been looking at different shapes we see in our everyday lives - rectangles, circles, squares and triangles. In English, the children have been learning how to write and order instructions when describing how to use a slide and a swing. Using verbs has been key such as push, pull, sit, and climb. The children have also started practicing their nativity songs and play parts will be given out over the next few weeks. It's the most wonderful time of the year!

#### Class Blake

In maths this week, the children have been learning how to add 3 and 2-digit numbers crossing over 100. For example, what is 58 + 74? In English, the children have been learning about Guy Fawkes and the Gunpowder Plot. Remember, Remember the 5th of November. Report writing has been the focus when looking at factual information and how we know events happened. In history, the children have started learning about The Great Fire of London. This has included looking at pictures of our wonderful capital city both past and present. The children have been writing about the difference between 1666 and 2023 in London.

#### Class Wiltshire

In maths this week, the children have learning about prime numbers. A prime number only has two factors - one and itself. For example, 17 is a prime number as the only two numbers that divide into are 1 and 17. The children have also been learning how to use a formal written method for multiplication. For example, what is 3427 x 23? In English, the children have started the book, 'Children of Winter' by Berlie Doherty. The children have been looking at features of diary writing and using the first person. For science, the children have started looking at friction and effects of air and water resistance between moving surfaces. For example, how does a parachute work? What forces and scientific phenomena take place?
