The children have been learning a range of new sounds in phonics this week. This has included Phase 5 sounds. In maths, the children have been recognising numerals to the correct words and in geography, identifying countries in the United Kingdom. My love for Northern Ireland was shared with everyone!

The children have been learning how to partition 2 and 3-digit numbers. For example, 342 is 300, 40 and 2. In science, the children have been investigating which materials tear, cut, stretch, and fold. In RE, the children have been recognising different symbols.

The children have been enjoying their class text, 'Spaceboy' and have been reading with expression and finding out the meanings of news words. In maths, Roman Numerals have been taught with the children recognising the correct letters to match to numbers.
