
The 'cold snap' looks set to continue so please take care when driving to and from school as the lanes will be icy,

Currículum News

Class Banksy

In maths this week, the children have been learning how to recognise numbers up to 20 and representing them in different ways as well as solving word problems. For example, If I had 18 cakes, and 4 were eaten, how many cakes would I have left? The spelling focus has been re-visiting common sounds in words to see if the children can recognise and spell correctly. As well as this, the children in Year have been practising saying different 'real' and 'nonsense' words. Well done, everyone! With just over one week to go until the Nativity, rehearsals are in full swing, and the children are working very hard to remember their lines and songs.

Class Blake

In art this week, the children have been designing and painting their own Tudor Houses. These were then set on fire to show the affect the Fire of London had on the city and how quickly it spread! Photographs have been uploaded to the school Facebook page. Times Tables have again been taught and patterns to help the children recall times tables at speed. The focus has been 2, 3, 4, 5 and 10 times tables. The children have also been working very hard with their SPAG work and remembering what adjectives, adverbs and noun phrases are. As well as this, how to recognise the past, present, and future tenses. For example, I was eating my dinner. I am eating my dinner. I will be eating my dinner.

In D/T this week, the children have started to design and build their bird houses. Lots of planning has taken place and the building stage took place this week. The children were discussing how their original plans may have to change and we discussed how important this is when designing. This week, assessments have been taking place across reading, SPAG and maths. These assessments have been key to see what the children have retained over this term, and for areas to be re-visited again during lessons. The children have worked extremely hard! Year 6 completed MOCK SATs papers with Mr. Merriman, and these will be used to further support the children moving forward into the school year. Well done to Year 4 for completing a practice Multiplication Check (MTC) and recalling times tables 1-12 at speed.
