Curriculum News

Class Banksy

In science, the children have been learning about sight and how eyes work. One of the activities was throwing objects into a bucket using both eyes, and then just one eye. In maths, the children have been learning about 1 more and counting on from any given number. The book 'Naughty Bus' has been introduced with the children, looking at sights and attractions in London.

Class Blake

In maths this week, the children have learning how to estimate where numbers are on a blank number line. In addition to this, the children have been comparing 2 and 3-digit numbers using the < and > sign. For example, 347 > 329. In SPAG, the children have been learning how to use the correct articles before nouns. For example, \underline{A} for ran down the road, and \underline{an} insect flew across the room.

Class Wiltshire

In maths this week, the children have been continuing securing their knowledge of place value and writing numbers up to 1,000,000. For example, write the number two million, four hundred and five thousand, eight hundred and sixteen. In English, the children have continued reading 'Spaceboy' and an escape plan has been planned and written. The children have been using their prediction skills with adventurous vocabulary.
