

Sports Premium Spending: 2015-16

Gaddesden Row JMI School uses the sports premium funding to make **additional** and **sustainable improvements** to the quality of PE and sport. We have developed and added to the PE and sport activities that the school already offers to encourage more pupils to take up sports activities. We have also made improvements that will not only benefit our current pupils but benefit pupils joining the school in future years. This year, the school received £8230.

Specialist sports coaching for KS2 pupils, including teacher professional development.	£2530	<p>The children have accessed a wide range of sports so far this year including football, hockey, basketball and netball. The children have received coaching from experienced coaches and the staff have been able to up skill by watching and participating in the lessons.</p> <p>Included in this cost is the entry to a local football league allowing local village schools to compete against each other. We came second in the league last year and one of our pupils was the highest goal scorer.</p> <p>This has had an impact at school and now many children are choosing to play football during the break times.</p> <p>The school has also entered a inter village school netball competition. This is held on a termly basis. Children have been enthusiastic about this and we have seen an increase in involvement by girls in sports during and after school.</p>
Specialist sports coaching for all Infant pupils, including teacher professional development.	£2050	<p>We have used skilled coaches to model PE lessons for KS1 teachers and TAs. The children have participated in multi sports activities to aid their skill levels with both gross and fine motor skills.</p>
A range of after school sports clubs open to all pupils.	Included in sports coaching costs	<p>These are run by specialist coaches with the aim of inclusion for all children. We that in mind we have altered the football club from last year and offered a range of sports. These have included multisport, netball, speed stacking and football. We have found this has had a huge impact on attainment by a wide range of children from reception up to year 6 and a balanced split of boys and girls.</p>

Training to support the teaching of PE and sport	£270	We have had access to the gymnasium in a local secondary school to enable the children to use and experience lessons in a large hall equipped with the latest apparatus. This has enthused all children involved. We aim to continue this on an annual basis.
Improve resources	£1100	Basketball nets and hoops. Ball play area. A mixture of playground equipment including ropes, small balls, stilts and basketballs. Footballs and netballs. Larger football goals and precision striking nets. Netball bibs Grass area to be all year round
Introduce new sports or activities	£2280	Introduced all KS2 pupils to new sports/activities such as Rock climbing, potholing and abseiling. This has encouraged more pupils to take up participation in sports. Whole school trip to be planned to include more sports/activities. Paralympian visit and workshop.
