Summary:

50% of our pupils eligible for the pupil premium are registered as having special educational needs or disabilities yet many make at least the same expected progress as non-SEND PP eligible pupils with many making accelerated progress and exceeding age related expectations in some cases. We are proud of the social and emotional progress our pupils eligible of the pupil premium make as well as their academic progress.
