The government states that the purpose of the Sports Premium is to fund improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, in the 2014 - 2015 academic year to give them the opportunity to develop a healthy lifestyle. activities to date (Autumn 14 to Spring 15)	cost	impact
Swimming tuition for all KS2 pupils (inc transport)	£762.20	Additional spending enabled us to have 3 tutors and differentiate further. This resulted in 15/31 pupils from Year 3 to Year 6 achieving the 'national curriculum' Year 6 level (6 Year 6s; 6 Year 5s; 1 Year 4 and 2 Year 3s).
Specialist sports coaching for KS2 pupils, including teacher professional development	£750	The specialist company arranged a football league with our neighbouring village schools. This had impact across the whole key stage as more children were included in the team. We are currently second placed in the league. We also were able to put a team in for Y5/6 football 5 a side tournament. We played against 3-form entry schools and came 6/8 - our pupils were praised by the other schools' staff for their determination, skills and resilience.
Specialist sports coaching for KS1 pupils, including teacher professional development	£600	Using skilled coaches to model teaching for our teachers has ensured that all our teachers have now had this opportunity and have grown in confidence. This can continue on a rolling programme.
Football clubs open to all pupils	£950	As more children take part in the clubs, more active sports are played by both girls and boys at lunch times (and see participation in football league above).

Participation in Health Related Behaviour Questionnaire	£60	The responses from this questionnaire aimed at Year 5 and 6 pupils will be used to direct outdoor and healthy activities going forward, as well as to shape some of our PSHE teaching.
Dacorum School Sports Network subscription	£600	Further access to sporting activities that would not be possible normally in a small school - eg the athletics festival and multi sports festivals for Reception and Year 1 pupils.
Transport		This funding enables us to take a professional approach to travelling to events, tournaments and matches (minibus hire).
Future activities (Summer 2015)	Likely cost	Anticipated impact
Specialist sports coaching KS2 (with multisports club)	£360	To continue professional development opportunities for teachers (including new members of staff and teaching assistants where appropriate); children to become proficient in a wider range of competitive sports, moving to rounders, athletics and cricket in the Summer term.
Specialist sports coaching KS1	£300	To ensure younger pupils are enthused by PE activities, as well as beginning to understand importance of physical activities and discipline in sport; ensure readiness for more competitive activities in Key Stage 2.
Football clubs (& multisports breakfast club)	£600	To increase fitness levels of pupils and participation in wider range of sporting activities introduced through multi sports.
Swimming	£270	Catch up sessions to ensure all pupils reach National Curriculum standard in Year 6
Teacher time for monitoring new curriculum	£400	This will allow our PE Coordinator to develop the use of assessment (without levels) in the new National Curriculum and to ensure progression in PE skills throughout the school.
Rounders league	£100	This should enable further participation with other village schools in competitive sports of a different nature, including both girls and boys and developing a different range of sporting skills.

Resources purchase	£927.35	Indoor athletics equipment: £660.50 Basket ball net and board: £200 Basket balls £36.85 Team tracksuits: £200
Watch live sporting events	£300	To raise aspirations of pupils in taking part in sport.
Athlete visit	£500	As above - also to hear about a different sport.
Mobile sporting experience	£555.45	To bring an experience in to school that would not otherwise be available.
